The name Russia is derived from Rus', a medieval state populated mostly by the East Slavs. However, this proper name became more prominent in the later history, and the country typically was called by its inhabitants "ruskaja zemlja" (ruskaja zemlja), which can be translated as "Russian Land" or "Land of Rus". Perestroika (/ ˌp ɛ r ɪ s t r ʊ k ɪ /; Russian: перестройка, IPA: [pʲɛrʲɪˈstrojkə]) was a political movement for reformation within the Communist Party of the Soviet Union during the 1980s and 1990s and is widely associated with Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev and his glasnost (meaning "openness") policy reform. The Russian Federation emerged as a great power in the early twenty-first century, also considered to be an energy superpower. The country is considered the Soviet Union's successor state in diplomatic matters, and is a permanent member of the United Nations Security Council.
