Friedrich Ludwig Gottlob Frege (/ ʧ f r e ? ? ? /; German: [ˈfʁiːdʁɪç ˈɡɔtˌlob ˈfʁe]; 8 November 1848 – 26 July 1925) was a German philosopher, logician, and mathematician. In the philosophy of language, the nature of meaning, its definition, elements, and types, was discussed by philosophers Aristotle, Augustine, and Aquinas. Philosophy is the systematic study of the foundations of human knowledge with an emphasis on the conditions of its validity and finding answers to ultimate questions. [archê] Greek term for beginning or ultimate principle. The Milesian philosophers looked for a single material stuff of which the entire universe is composed, while Empedocles identified no fewer than four elements whose mixture makes up ordinary things., Frege Penguin Philosophy.
