New York, 198 U.S. 45 (1905), was a landmark U.S. labor law case in the US Supreme Court, holding that limits to working time violated the Fourteenth Amendment. The stoneware production styles of New York State mirrored that of New England: potters began with an aesthetic reminiscent of the New York City potters, then moved toward finer, straight-sided forms adorned with bright cobalt designs.
